





Rules Word List (with Exceptions)

Words with one syllable and the sound /j/ use -dge after a short vowel sound.

wedge ledge
pledge hedge
ledge ridge
bridge smidge
dodge lodge

fudge smudge

nudge trudge

badge

Exceptions: partridge, cartridge, knowledge, acknowledge, porridge

Words with one syllable and a short vowel and ending with 'f', 'l', 's' or 'z', double the consonant.

bluff cuff fluff gruff bell tell mill doll full jazz fizz buzz bless kiss fuss bliss

Exceptions: grass, staff, class (depending on pronunciation)

Nouns that end with 's', 'x', 'z', 'ch' or 'sh', add 'es' to make plurals.

bush/bushes

address/addresses

bench/benches

lunch/lunches

splash/splashes

buzz/buzzes

box/boxes

dress/dresses

tax/taxes

fax/faxes



Exceptions: If the 'ch' is pronounced with a 'k' then add 's'; e.g. stomach/stomachs.

The vowel before a double consonant in a two-syllable word is most often a short vowel.

Rules Word List (with Exceptions) - continued

If the word ends in 'f', change 'f' to 'v' and add 'es' to make plurals.

calf/calves leaf/leaves life/lives elf/elves

wife/wives shelf/shelves

thief/thieves yourself/yourselves

scarf/scarves wolf/wolves

dwarf/dwarves (or dwarfs)

Exceptions: roof/roofs, hoof/hoofs or hooves; wharf/wharves or wharfs; handkerchief/handkerchieves or handkerchiefs; chief/chiefs; oaf/oafs; cliff/ cliffs; gulf/gulfs; reef/reefs; belief/beliefs; proof/proofs

To make the plural of a word ending in 'y', change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'es'.

try/tries cry/cries baby/babies story/stories cherry/cherries activity/activities spy/spies ferry/ferries puppy/puppies pony/ponies daisy/daisies berry/berries body/bodies army/armies lady/ladies sky/skies

Exceptions: donkey/donkeys, Sunday/ Sundays, toy/toys, boy/boys, key/keys

If a word ends in a consonant followed by 'y', change 'y' to 'i' before adding suffixes like -es and -ed.

carry/carries, carried fly/flies reply/replies, replied

reply/replies, replied

study/studies, studied

fry/fries, fried

party/parties, partied

marry/marries, married

dry/dries, dried

lady/ladies

worry/worries, worried

copy/copies, copied

hurry/hurries, hurried

pity/pities, pitied

Exceptions: Where the 'y' is preceded by a vowel or the suffix begins with 'i', including -ing, -ish, -ist; e.g. crying, copyist, playing.

A one-syllable word with a short vowel sound before 'ch' uses '-tch' at the end.

batch stretch Dutch notch witch etch clutch catch ditch latch stitch sketch patch switch crutch pitch

Exceptions: such, much, which, rich





Write spelling words randomly in each column of the table. Repeat words if needed to fill up the columns.




Word Ladders
